	By SORFO (over phone) Turnover of more than 30 lakh is for bidders of one circle or all 8 circles? If a firm applies for only one circle whether less turnover (proportionately) can be accepted for eligibility if all other eligibility criteria is fulfilled?	Yes, bidders with less turnover (proportionately eg Rs. 30 lakh / 8 circle = 3.75 lakh turnover per circle) can also apply. Rs. 30 lakh turnover is for 8 circles. If otherwise selected, bidders with less than 30 lakh turnover, will qualify for number of circles proportionately to their turnover.	Page 10 NB (first bullet) "One bidder can bid for one or more than one or all the eight circles of the state (circle wise data enclosed at Annexure – VI B). However, the committee reserves the right to allow all or few circles to any bidder depending upon their capability and inter se ranking in Technical & Financial bids."  Here capability includes financial experience, manpower, turnover etc. as may be decided by Technical Committee.
